Report of the Board of Health.

The local Board of Health submits the following report :

Four quarterly meetings were held during the year for the purpose of considering the sanitary condition of the town. The first half of the past year was exceptionally healthy, while epidemics of dysentery, grip and chicken pox prevailed during the fall and winter months. Notwithstanding the fact that the epidemics were extensive the death rate shows no increase over that of previous years.

REMARKS.

In concluding our report we feel safe in saying that our schools have enjoyed another year of prosperity. In hiring our teachers we have employed local talent and have endeavored to place each teacher where they would be best adapted to the requirements of the school, and with the exception of one or two instances the order and advancement have been all that could be desired.

At present our schools are quite well supplied with text-books. A change of readers would be of benefit to the scholars as those in use have been in the schools since '90.

Many needed repairs have been accomplished in the past year. Four of the school-houses have been painted on the outside and three of the rooms have been painted and papered adding much to their general appearance and comfort. Two of our school rooms are fitted with frame seats and I would urge that money be raised to furnish the others in a like manner.

I would recommend the following appropriations:
For repairs, \$75 : Text-books, \$75.
